## Final Report: FIRTA Grant No. 87/98: Scholarship for Trainee Fishermen

Scholarship payments made under this grant totalled 69115 and are tabulated in Appendices A and B.

#### <u>Summary</u>

Certificate of Technology in Fisheries Operations (CTFO) Scholarships were awarded to 28 students and totalled \$21747. Students were from the following States: Queensland (11), Western Australia (2), Victoria (4), Tasmania (3), South Australia (3) and New South Wales (5). Outright passes were recorded by 21 students, six others have been granted supplementary exams and one failed.

Bachelor of Applied Science in Fisheries Technology (BAS) Scholarships were awarded to 38 students and totalled \$47368. Students were from Queensland (3), Western Australia (13), Victoria (5), Tasmania (4), South Australia (1), New South Wales (8), Northern Territory (1) and ACT (3). The 17 scholarship recipients in Semester II 1987 (Appendix A) all passed their year-end examinations.

#### Selection Criteria

The following criteria were applied when assessing Scholarship applications:

- (i) Likelihood of student passing examinations, ultimately graduating and becoming a useful recruit to the fishing industry. Based on: Attendance; diligence in class and on FTV "Bluefin"; academic performance; ability to interact with students/staff.
- (ii) Extent of committment to a career in the fishing industry. Based on: Pre-enrolment work experience; year of study at School of Fisheries; work experience gained during semester and course breaks; family committment to the industry.
- (iii) Financial need.

#### <u>General</u>

Maximum amounts claimable for specified types of expenditure have been fixed (e.g. Accomodation \$70 per week (1987) and \$90 per week (1988), Books and Equipment \$250 per year). Actual Scholarships awarded vary considerably, dependant on distances travelled to the College and on whether other grants are received (e.g. Austudy)

The availability of FIRTA Scholarships encourages enrolment in these fisheries courses and contributes to the training and subsequent recruitment of skilled fisheries graduates into the Australian industry. Although it will take time for these graduates to work their way into senior positions, there is already evidence of their upward mobility in the workforce. The School is consequently convinced that the FIRTA trainee scheme is achieving its objectives and is most appreciative of the level of support received.
